Re: Excused Absence to Observe the Islamic Holiday of Eid al-Fitr

To Whom It May Concern,

Muslims across the world will be celebrating the Islamic holiday of Eid Al-Fitr (Festival of Fast Breaking) on Friday, April 21st, 2023.

Eid al-Fitr marks the end of Ramadan, a month of fasting, prayer, and reflection. Please excuse Muslim students and employees from school and/or work during this holiday. Eid al-Fitr celebrations include a worship service in the morning, visitation with family and friends, and exchanging of gifts.

Observing this holiday is the First Amendment right of Muslim students and employees. They may request a day off to celebrate Eid with their family and friends, and schools and employees are required to offer reasonable accommodations. For students, this includes an excused absence, accommodations for assignments, and any other support determined necessary by educators and parents.
